



Are you doing morning work tubs, but struggling to compile enough activities for all of your students?



Morning Work Tubs

Supplies Needed

Supplies for students to use:

Magnetic letters or letter tiles

Clothespin

Glitter (I used white glitter to look like snow) in a container

Dry-erase markers in a variety of colors

Plastic ice cubes (or another type of blocks)

Plastic links

Mini snowflakes, winter mini-erasers, or another type of manipulative

Plastic linking cubes

Plastic counting chips

Plastic pony beads (blue, yellow, green, purple, red, orange, pink, white)

Pipe cleaners, shoelaces, plastic cord, or yarn

Pom-pom balls (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple)

Pencil

Paper clip

Mini whiteboard

OPTIONAL ITEMS: Plastic tweezers or tongs, plastic penguin figurine, sensory bin with cotton balls/rice/beans, and a pocket cube.

Preparing the activities:

Dot stickers (or any stickers, or just a permanent marker)

Cardstock

Laminating machine

Scissors or paper trimmer

Storing the activities:

Tubs or gallon-sized zipper baggies
