




Materials Needed:

Mini erasers Pom-pom balls Plastic tweezers Playdough Sand tray Dry-erase markers Student scissors Glue stick Crayons Plastic links Clothespin Dot stickers for clip cards Fish stickers (or regular dot stickers) Plastic spinner Single hole-punch Printer paper and cardstock Laminator and laminating pouches

Penguin Slides

Print and laminate the pages. Students will use mini erasers or pom-pom balls to line the pathway. Students can use plastic tweezers to transfer the items to the pathway.





Shape Building Cards

Print the cards on cardstock. Cut out and laminate. Students will use playdough to form each shape. Instead of playdough, students could also use mini erasers or pom-pom balls.





Letter Writing Cards

Print the cards on cardstock. Cut out and laminate. Students will write the letters in sand.




Line Tracing Cards

Print the cards on cardstock. Cut out and laminate. Students will trace the lines from top to bottom using a dry-erase marker.




Penguin Puzzles

Choose one of the puzzle pages. Students will color and cut out the puzzle(s), then mix up the pieces and glue them.



Tweezing Cards


Print the cards on cardstock. Cut out and laminate. Students will show each number by transferring pom-pom balls to the sled. I used white pom-pom balls to look like snow balls. You could also use cotton balls or plastic ice cubes!




Linking

There are two options: color-matching or addition to 5. Choose one version. Print on cardstock. Cut out and laminate. Then use a single hole-punch to punch holes where indicated. Students will link the correct color fish or the correct addition


sentences.






Clip Cards

Print the activity on cardstock. Cut out and laminate the cards. Place a dot sticker on the back of each card to indicate the correct answer. Students will count the penguins on the card and clip the correct number.



Letter Building Cards

Print the activity on cardstock. Cut out and laminate the cards. Students will use mini erasers or pom-pom balls to form each letter.



Penguin's Pail Sticker Activity

Print the activity on cardstock. Cut out the spinner and laminate the pieces. Students will spin a number and cover that many dots with fish stickers (or dot stickers).

Alternatives:

- . Use the activity with no spinner. Students just cover the dots at their own pace.
- 2. Instead of stickers, you can use mini erasers or other small manipulatives.
